**Position Summary**

- The Vice President for Facilities Management provides strategic leadership, coordination, and administrative oversight to facilities planning, engineering, design & construction, energy and environmental initiatives and the operation of the physical plant of Brown University.
  
- Works closely with senior leadership to provide the overall strategic direction to Facilities Management projects and operations, as well as with members of the Brown University Corporation.

**Responsibilities**

- Oversees and evaluates a facilities management operation comprised of 332 staff (union and non-union).
  
- Manages 235 facilities comprised of over 6.5 million square feet of space on approximately 145 acres in Providence, including a presence in the downtown Jewelry District (Laboratories for Molecular Medicine), and 375 acres in Bristol, RI.
  
- Directs a current capital construction program in excess of \$500 million, an operating budget totaling \$53 million annually and a facility renewal budget of \$7 million annually.
  
- Oversees the planning and design processes including the selection and management of planners, designers and architects. Ensures that the planning efforts remain consistent with and responsive to the University's Plan for Academic Enrichment, which requires support for an increasingly complex research environment.
  
- Serves on various University committees including the President's Executive Committee, Provost's Space Committee and the Campus Planning Advisory Board. Serves as staff to the Corporation Committee on Facilities & Design and the Public Art Committee.
